 - a. **Waiver of Protected Taxes**

On May 14, 2018 the DLGF certified that Randolph Central School Corporation is eligible under IC 6-1.1-20.6-9.9 to waive implementation of protected taxes.

F. New Business

1. WCHS Assistant Principal

Mr. Abraham will recommend that the Board hire Jordan Winkle as the new Assistant Principal at Winchester Community High School. Mr. Winkle will work a 205 day contract and will be paid \$60,000.00 the first year providing he secures an Emergency Administrators Permit in July of 2018. The second year of his contract Mr. Winkle will be paid \$63,000.00 provided he has completed his administrator program, secures a valid Indiana Building Administrators License, and has an effective or highly effective rating.

2. Resolution Naming the O.R. Baker Elementary School Foyer

Mr. Abraham will recommend that the Board adopt the resolution naming the foyer at O.R. Baker Elementary School the “Cynthia Ann Winkle Foyer” in honor of her outstanding leadership and years of service to the students of Randolph Central School Corporation.

3. Fifth Grade Chromebook Pilot

Mr. Abraham will recommend that the Board approve the purchase of 134 Chromebooks for a 5th grade pilot project. The total cost is \$30,284.00. Willard elementary will pay for 95 student devices at a cost of \$21,470.00 from their TBR Fund. Deerfield Elementary will be issued 33 devices at a cost of \$7,458.00 with these devices being paid for out of the General Fund. Two teachers at Deerfield and four teachers at Willard will be issued devices for a total cost of \$1,356.00 and these will be paid for from the 2016 GO Bond Fund.

4. Graduation Chord Discussion

Currently WCHS graduates are only allowed to wear a NHS and/or a STGEC chord during the graduation ceremony. The Board will discuss a request to allow chords for recognition of other accomplishments.

5. Title One Administrator

Mr. Abraham will recommend that the Board approve two additional days for Laura Miller to work with Cindy Winkle to take over the Title One Administrator position for RCSC. The total cost will not exceed \$825.00 and will be paid from Title One funds.

6. Out-of-State Field Trips

a. Willard Elementary Fifth Grade Trip to Kings Island

Mr. Abraham will recommend the Board approve the request from Mr. Duncan for 5th grade students that have a accumulated 300 combined Accelerated Reader points in grades 3-5 to go on a field trip to Kings Island on Tuesday, May 29th. Mr. Duncan will drive the minibus for this trip.
